

Obtaining Census Tract Data Priority ReLeaf

To find out the census tract number for the proposed planting area, follow these steps. If you already know the number, skip to step 7 to obtain a census report.

1. Go to <http://factfinder.census.gov>
2. Click on *Enter a street address* on the left under *Address Search* to find Census 2000 data.
3. Enter the address, city, state and zip code.
4. Click *Go*.
5. In the box that appears, the census tract data for the address should be listed. It is a 4-digit number.
6. Make note of the number and proceed to the next step for obtaining a census report for the tract.
7. Go to <http://www.oseda.missouri.edu/>
8. Click on *Data Archives* at the top of the page.
9. In the *Date Archives* screen, click on *Decennial Census 2000*.
10. In the Quick Links box on the left, click on "SF3 Profiles."
11. Below the heading, you will see a list of states from which you can choose to view data. Click on *Missouri*. Click *Tracts* to search by census tract.
12. Select your county from the new table. The next screen will give you a table with tract numbers. Choose your census tract number.
13. Once you have selected your census tract, a report will appear. This report does not contain income information. Therefore, you will need to scroll down the page until you reach the end of the report. Click on the link *Related Applications* below the report.
14. This will bring you to another list of categories of reports. Click on "*DP3 2K*" *Demographic Profile Using Data From SF3*.
15. A report containing more detailed information, including poverty numbers will appear.
16. Print out your report.

To find out the data on the number of students are eligible to receive free or reduced-price lunches at a particular school, follow these steps.

1. Go to www.dese.mo.gov/schooldata/.
2. Under *Make a Selection*, select your school district.
3. Click *Load Profile*.
4. In the boxes of reports, click on *2005 School District "Report Cards"* in the upper right corner.
5. Find the name of the school and click the arrows to the right.
6. Once the data appears, scroll down to find the table with data on the *Percentage of Students Eligible for Free or Reduced-Price Lunch*.
